Guidelines for GRASP Award

Article 1 – Objectives:

GRASP Awards allow GRASP members to welcome in their labs new and continuing M.Sc. and Ph.D. Students as well as Post-doctoral Fellows

Article 2 - Conditions of the award:

- ❖Duration: 18 months appointment
- ❖Non-renewable
- ❖Amount of awards (given out over 18 months)
 - > \$6,000 for M.Sc. Students
 - > \$7,500 for Ph.D. Students
 - \$11,250 for Post-doctoral Fellows

Article 3 - Eligibility:

- The candidate must register to a graduate studies program (M.Sc. or Ph.D.) or as post-doctoral fellow in the university where his research director is affiliated.
- ❖ The director of the candidate must be a regular or associate GRASP member.
- ❖ The candidate must be registered at a Quebec institution.
- Cannot be held concurrently with other studentship/fellowships awards worth more than \$25,000 per annum for graduate students or \$35,000 for postdoctoral fellows.

Article 4 - To submit an application for a GRASP award:

- ❖ The application must be submitted by email to grasp.med@mcgill.ca by 5:00 pm on Wednesday, December 21st, 2016
- Please submit a single pdf file titled "family name_first name_GRASP Award" that includes the following:
 - The application form (follow the instructions provided to fill the form out)
 - > Academic transcripts (to be scanned and included in the application pdf)
- Only complete applications will be considered.

Article 5 – Evaluation of the application and selection criteria:

- Outstanding academic record and scientific productivity of the candidate.
- * Research Project: quality, multidisciplinarity, and relatedness to the GRASP's mission.

Article 6 - Attribution of the GRASP Award

The results are published via email by the GRASP office.

Article 7 - Access to the files

All files are confidential and only the committee's members and the GRASP administration have the right to access them. Copies of the files are destroyed after each session and only the originals are kept at the GRASP office to be archived.
